## Introduction

The City of Watervliet has undertaken this process to prepare a Parks and Recreation Master Plan as a road map for parks and recreation decisions made over the next five years. A community's access to resources and activities directly impacts the quality of life of its residents and visitors. Park and recreation facilities engage people in a community and keep them active and healthy. The City has developed this plan in accordance with the Guidelines for the Development of Community Park, Recreation, Open Space, and Greenway Plans established by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR). In order to retain eligibility for state and federal park and recreation grant programs, the City must have a current five-year plan approved by MDNR. The purpose of this document is for planning purposes and all elements are dependent upon available funding.

The City has undertaken this plan in an effort to:


- Guide investment in parks, recreation, and open space;
- Assess present community recreational facilities and programs;
- Inventory parks, natural areas, and open spaces;
- Solicit public input and response regarding parks, recreation, and open space;
- Identify goals and prioritize improvements and acquisitions;
- Establish a course of action for improvements and acquisitions over the next five years; and
- Identify potential funding sources to satisfy the goals of the plan and the needs of residents and visitors.



# Community Description

## **Regional Setting**

Watervliet is located in the northeast portion of Berrien County, Michigan. The City is bordered entirely by Watervliet Township. It is 90 miles from Chicago, 35 miles from South Bend, Indiana, 50 miles from Kalamazoo, and 90 miles from Grand Rapids. The City lies adjacent to Interstate 94 and is bisected by Red Arrow Highway.



#### Land Use

The most prominent land use in Watervliet is single-family neighborhoods and institutions such as churches and schools. The City's commercial district is compact and convenient for pedestrians. It is located primarily along the thoroughfare of Main Street, north of Red Arrow Highway. This pattern of development is conducive to creating a vibrant, walkable downtown.

## **Transportation**

The transportation system in and around Watervliet is predominantly auto-oriented. Interstate 94 serves as the primary transportation route from other Midwestern states, making it one the most important thoroughfares in Watervliet. The I-94 interchange at M-140 provides convenient access to the city.

Commercial airline flights are available at the South Bend International Airport (44 miles south) and Kalamazoo International Airport (47 miles east). Local service is also available at the Southwest Michigan Regional Airport in Benton Harbor (10 miles southwest).

Amtrak passenger service terminals are located in St. Joseph with service to Chicago or Grand Rapids and in Kalamazoo with service to Detroit.

#### **Natural Characteristics**

#### Climate

The climate of Watervliet and the surrounding area can be classified as generally mild. There are no unusual climatic conditions that severely impede activities within the City. January and June are the snowiest and rainiest months, respectively. Due to the variations in the weather patterns in southwest Michigan and location near Lake Michigan, local residents experience the four seasons together with increased cloudiness, lake effect snow, and consistently moderate temperatures throughout the year.


#### Vegetation

Most of the City's native vegetation has been lost to development. However, some relatively undisturbed areas are still available along the Paw Paw River and Mill Creek where you will see beech, maple, oak, and hickory trees. Much of this land is owned by the City or Berrien County where it is

preserved as parkland or open space. A few larger undeveloped, forested parcels are privately owned, one of which is 153 acres in size.


#### Wetlands

Wetlands include areas characterized by the presence of water that either saturates the soil or covers the land surface for all or portions of the year and where such environments foster the growth of specific plant species. According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the City contains areas of wetlands primarily along the Paw Paw River and Mill Creek (see map). All of the wetlands are described as primarily emergent or forested and semi-permanently, seasonally or temporarily flooded. Some areas are forested or scrub/shrub with broad-leaf deciduous plants and trees.



## Potential Conservation Areas (PCAs)


Potential Conservation Areas (PCAs) are defined as places on the landscape dominated by native vegetation that have various levels of potential for harboring high quality natural areas and unique natural features. Scoring criteria used to prioritize sites included: total size, size of core area, length of stream corridor, landscape connectivity, restorability of surrounding land, vegetation quality, and biological rarity score. The City of Watervliet includes high to highest areas of PCAs within its borders as seen below.



Understanding of these PCAs will help the City guide and target its recreation efforts while protecting its valuable natural resources.

#### Rivers and Creeks

The City of Watervliet sits along the Paw Paw River and Hays Park provides access to the 68 mile Paw Paw River Water Trail.



Mill Creek is a Type 1 Michigan Inland Trout & Salmon designated Trout Stream.

## Administrative Structure

## 1. City Commission

The City of Watervliet is a council-manager form of government with a Mayor and six commissioners. Additionally, they have a five member Planning Commission and a nine member DDA. The <u>City Commission</u> is the elected governing body authorized to adopt ordinances and enter into agreements and contracts as well as adopt the Parks and Recreation Master Plan. The Parks Committee for the City studies parks-related issues and makes recommendations for action to the City. The Parks Committee will recommend spending priorities based on the five-year recreation plan as adopted and amended, as appropriate by the City Commission. The Parks Committee does not have direct supervision or authority in the city. <u>City maintenance staff</u> is responsible for routine maintenance and repairs for parks and recreational facilities.

## 2. Funding & Budgets

Funding for Parks and Recreation is included in the General Fund City budget. Other funding sources may include, but are not limited to, MDNR grants, public and private foundation grants and/or awards, special appropriations, donations, millages, other forms of public finance, or a combination of some of these. The 2019-2020 Parks and Recreation Budget is \$42,800 for operation, maintenance and repairs.

## 3. Volunteers & Relationships with Other Organizations

The City of Watervliet collaborates with Berrien County for regional Parks and Recreation activities. Berrien County recently developed the 14-acre Paw Paw River County Park across from Hayes Park. This park is adjacent to the Paw Paw River and has hiking trails, overlooks, fishing access, and an accessible kayak launch.

The City works with and financially assists the Two Rivers Coalition, a nonprofit organization working to protect and preserve the Black River and Paw Paw River Watersheds in southwest Michigan, through an annual membership fee and \$2,500 - \$5,000 toward river cleanup projects each year.

Watervliet Public Schools utilize Hays Park for its season soccer practices, sharing upkeep and maintenance tasks at the site.

#### Volunteers

When public improvement projects occur, the City asks for volunteers through its email and/or school networks. Many citizens respond and provide volunteer help. The DDA is an additional resource for volunteer help. The high school regularly supplies volunteers to assist with community service and park repair projects.

# Parks and Recreation Inventory

In October 2019, Abonmarche staff conducted an on-site inventory of the recreational facilities located in the City of Watervliet. Watervliet has one **Community Park**, Hays Park. This type of park meets community-based recreation needs and serves an area between ½ and 3 miles. The City has two **Neighborhood Parks**, Flaherty Park and Sterner Park. This type of park is multi-purpose and serves as the recreational and social focus of a neighborhood. It provides areas for both passive and active recreation activities such as fields, playgrounds, picnicking, and trails. It serves an area between ¼ and ½-mile. The City has one **Mini Park**, Veteran's Park, which serves a ¼-mile area and provides amenities such as greenery and seating.

The City has received three development grants from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to assist with its development of public parks:

TF91-391 Mill Creek Park (currently named Flaherty Park) Grant Amount \$114,000

Improve fishing access and play equipment along Mill Creek, including restroom/shelter building, paved parking and walkways with landscaping.

Grant is closed and in compliance with DNR requirements.

## **TF01-011 Hays Park Improvements** Grant Amount \$70,000

Construction of low maintenance play structure and new concession/restroom facility in Hays Park.

Grant is closed and in compliance with DNR requirements.

## TF04-057 Hays Park Project Grant Amount \$42,300


Waterfront improvements along the Paw Paw River to include a fishing pier and canoe launch. Also develop a skateboard park.

Grant is closed and in compliance with DNR requirements.

The park classification corresponds to the classification system in Appendix B of the Guidelines for the Development of Community Park, Recreation, Open Space and Greenway Plans published by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources in June 2018. Accessibility at each park was reviewed by comparing it to the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design. The number listed in the Accessibility Rating column (also taken from the Guidelines) is as follows:

- 1. None of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 2. Some of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 3. Most of the facilities/park areas meet accessibility guidelines
- 4. The entire park meets accessibility guidelines
- 5. The entire park was developed/renovated using the principles of universal design





Map 4: Surrounding Parks and Recreation Facilities




# Planning and Public Input

A systems approach to planning was used to assess the parks and recreation needs of the Watervliet community. Public input is a key component of this process and the development of this plan. The methods used for soliciting public input included a survey, public comment period for the draft plan, and a public hearing. These were broad enough to represent the community at large. Participants included members of the public at all age levels as well as key stakeholders in parks and recreation planning within the City.

## 1. Survey

An online survey was conducted in October and November of 2019. The survey had a total of 159 respondents. All household members, adults and children, were asked to complete the survey. Some key takeaways from the results are summarized below. The full survey is available in Appendix A.

- A majority of respondents (57%) were full time city residents, with 37% responding from a neighboring community.
- Respondent **age groups** were fairly evenly distributed between ages 21-29 (11%), 30-39 (26%), 40-49 (25%), 50-59 (19%) and 60 and older (17%).
- Six respondents indicated their household had **special accessibility needs** for park amenities.
- 66% of respondents indicated they strongly encourage parks and public open space development.
- Highly available recreation opportunities included fishing, walking trails, athletic fields, boating and canoeing/kayaking. A community recreation center, splash pad and ice skating were listed as least available.



- The two highest ranked actions indicated by respondents were to maintain/develop recreational trails and bike paths, and protect water resources.
- How well the City provided services were ranked as below:

- The majority of respondents felt safe to very safe in the parks (81%).
- Hays Park was the most used park. Few people are aware of the existence of Sterner Park.
- 77% of respondents would favor an improved bike network and 93% would support an improved/expanded trail system for walking and hiking.
- Open ended responses indicated the community liked its parks, the disc golf, water and walking trails. Many were very appreciative that the city sought their input through the survey.
- Many of the open ended comments asking for things they didn't like mentioned the need for public restrooms to be open at all parks, consistent maintenance not being done, that parks are closed in the winter, and equipment is out of date.
- Suggested improvements for the parks included adding a splash pad, updating equipment, keeping bathrooms open, a dog park, expanding bike, hiking and walking trails, and doing something with the former paper mill site.
- Respondents seem to enjoy their community very much and support improvements to public recreation.

## 2. Public Review and Hearing of Draft Plan

The final draft of this Plan was made available at Watervliet City Hall and the City's website on December 6, 2019. A notice of availability to review the plan was published in the Tri-City Record on December 5, 2019.

Following the review period, a public hearing was held January 7, 2020 at City Hall, 158 W. Pleasant Street, Watervliet, Michigan.



# Goals and Objectives

Information gathered from the community description, inventory, and a public survey was evaluated and used to formulate a mission, goals, and objectives. These goals form the basis of the Action Plan in the next chapter.

#### Goals

**Goal 1** - Make a variety of quality recreational environments and opportunities readily accessible to all of its citizens regardless of age or ability.

Objective: Provide ADA accessible routes to all public recreation within the city

A wide range of ages and ability levels exist within the community. Feedback from the public survey indicated a need for more paved and ADA paths to reach all the recreation options available.

Goal 2 – Work to maximize utilization of parks.

Objective: Provide amenities, maintenance, signage, recreation equipment, lighting etc. to provide maximum enjoyment and use of parks.

Community members enjoy the parks but expressed a desire for improvements to make them more usable. Suggestions included more lighting to expand hours of use, more recreation options at each park, open bathrooms, rules prominently displayed so everyone knows, more things to do at parks, etc.

**Goal 3** – Collaborate and cooperate with surrounding communities and parks on recreation opportunities.

Objective: Work with Watervliet Township and Berrien County Parks to coordinate and extend recreation opportunities for the community.

Public response indicated a high appreciation of recreation options provided by neighboring Berrien County Parks and Watervliet Township. Coordinating recreation options with these neighbors will offer the entire area more recreation options in the most cost effective and efficient way.

**Goal 4** – Create more outdoor connectivity within community through trails and paths.

Objective: Provide the public with non-motorized options to access parks, exercise and enjoy the outdoors.

Community response indicated a high level of interest in trails and connectivity between parks. The public also wants to enjoy recreation options locally, without having to drive somewhere.

Goal 5 – Protect, acquire, and preserve natural resources within the community.

Objective: To recognize the value of natural resources in the community and protect the natural environment through green infrastructure choices and sustainable design features in parks.

The public enjoys and takes advantage of the natural landscape and expressed a strong desire to protect it while enjoying it.



## **Action Plan**

The previous sections of this plan have set the foundation for the following Action Plan. The Action Plan is intended to implement the Goals and Objectives over the next five years. The City hopes to initiate the following improvements as funding and planning allow. Priorities should be reviewed on an annual basis and adjusted according to updated findings and identification of funding opportunities.

## Priorities are defined as follows:

- Priority A = Most Important (such as projects that are of highest concern for the community or rectify a problem)
- Priority B = Very Important (such as desirable improvements)
- Priority C = Important (such as projects that need further study)

## Timeframes are defined as follow:

- 1 = Within one year
- 2 = 1-3 years
- 3 = 3 + years
- 4 = As available
- 5 = Ongoing






## Q1 Which of the choices represents your residency in Watervliet?


## Q2 What is your age?


# Q3 Which of the following age groups does your household consist of? Please select all that apply.

# Q4 Does anyone in your household have special accessibility needs for park amenities?




# Q6 How much should the City of Watervliet encourage parks and public open space development?






Q11 Would you favor an improved bike network (either non-motorized or
